LA County Health Allows Modified Quarantines

Following a three-week <u>40% drop in county covid cases</u> in K-12 students, LA county school districts can now choose to implement a reduced or "modified quarantine" protocol for close contacts of a positive covid case.

In short, unvaccinated close contacts can stay out of quarantine if both the positive case and the close contact were both masked at the time of transmission and if the contact tests negative twice in the following week.

"We feel comfortable that, with relatively low transmission at schools, it's appropriate to offer schools a modified quarantine option for K-12 students," said LA County Public Health Director Barbara Ferrer at a <u>news conference on Friday, Sept 17</u>.

Now in line with the <u>CDC recommendation_updated</u> on Aug 5, followed by the <u>CA Dept Public Health</u> on September 1, this "modified" protocol allows districts a way to keep more students in school. At Friday's announcement, Ferrer also noted that an <u>extremely low (.2%) transmission rate</u> was found in quarantined close contacts (15,655 students from Aug 15 through Sept 13.), which contributed to the health dept's decision to loosen quarantine requirements. (Those quarantined contacts, predominately from LAUSD, made up about <u>2% of the countywide K-12 student body</u>.)

Here in La Canada, LCUSD Superintendent Wendy Sinnette told attendees of Monday's LCE PTA meeting that there have been no positive covid cases throughout all LCUSD schools in the past two weeks. But that bit of good news doesn't reflect the passionate feelings surrounding the district's covid protocols. Sinnette observed that in the 100+ parent emails she receives daily, it's "split" between parents who tell her the district is doing "too much" or "not enough".

"We're trying to thread the needle here," said Sinnette on balancing limiting covid exposure and

policies that keep not only positive cases but also their fellow classmates out of school.

In response to LA county's modified quarantine update, Sinette told the Lion Times that the district's school board must approve the protocol before it could be implemented at LCUSD schools.

School districts nationwide are walking a tightrope between minimizing covid peril vs applying too broad a brush on keeping students out of classrooms. **Districts in Illinois** are implementing this "modified" approach recommended by the CDC, CADPH and the LADPH. But limited resources in monitoring (dual masking) and testing at schools are the two most commonly cited reasons that more districts choose not to adopt modified quarantines.

"You have to be super careful that you know for sure and are able to verify that close contacts to cases had only mask-on-mask exposure," noted Ferrer on Friday.

But modified quarantines shouldn't be confused with "test-to-stay" quarantine protocol, which is not currently recommended by the <u>CDC</u> or LADPH. Test-to-stay is currently used in districts in <u>MA, UT, GA</u> and even <u>KY</u>. In this policy, daily rapid tests alone determine if a student can attend school, regardless of a student's masking or vaccinated status. Most, but not all, districts that "test-to-stay" also mandate masks.

No doubt the LCUSD Governing Board will take its turn at debating the pros and cons of modified quarantines at its next meeting, Sept 28.
